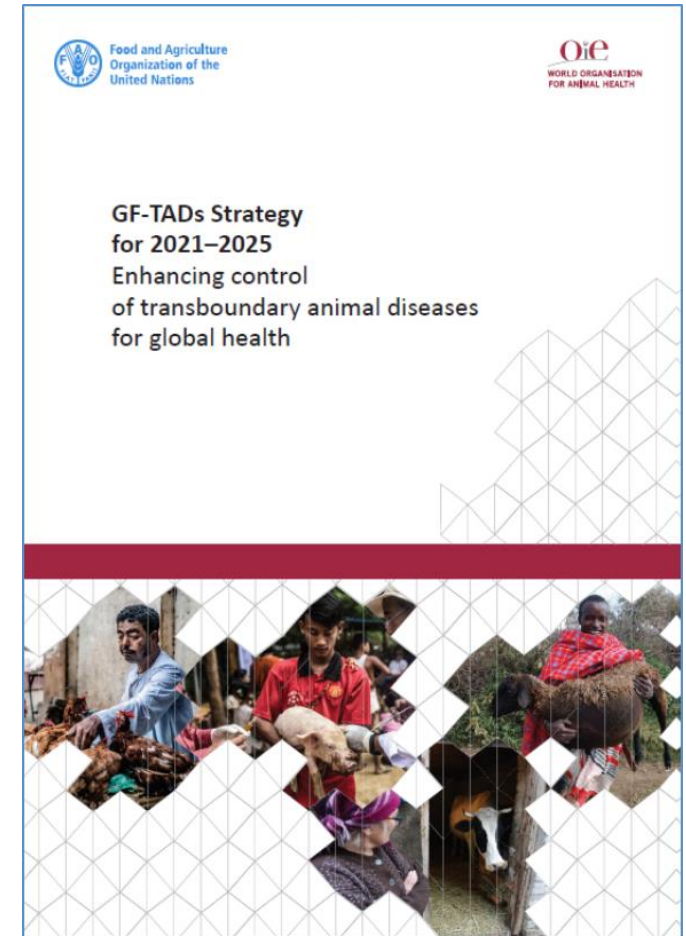

## Background

To reach the goals of the GF-TADs Strategy a **Partnerships and Financing Panel (GF-TADs PFP)** has been established to:

- Provide guidance to the members of the GF-TADs governance bodies including the Management Committee, Global Steering Committee and Regional Steering Committees;
- Address the need to develop sustainable partnerships and financing mechanisms for countries and territories to support their TADs prevention and control activities.

## Aim and specific tasks

To provide guidance on:

- **Financing** the prevention and control of TADs;
- **Developing partnerships** for Member countries to increase the sustainability of their TADs control strategies;
- **Connecting the funding and financing** capacities of specific TADs strategies and identify concrete relevant targets and linkages with financial institutes.

Such guidance will consider the multi-sectorial dimension of partners (such as the UN, international organizations, academia, private sector, NGOs, civil society and Regional Economic Committees (RECs) such as ASEAN, IGAD, AU, ECOWAS, SADC and others)



## Context

- Given the complex environment and current financing/investment challenges faced by countries and regions in the control of specific TADs.
- The exchanges at GF-TADs level remain often focused on single diseases.
- During consultations on the GF-TADs strategy, regional road maps, regional steering committee, most regions and many countries expressed a need to receive support to advocate and increase their capacity to advocate for disease control activities.
- The level of involvement of private partners in GF-TADs activities varies a lot and is often limited.

## The PFP Establishment



The 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the PFP was held on:

- 13 May 2022
- The panel currently consists of 13 members from various organizations around the globe.

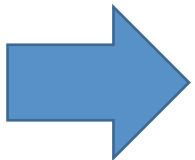
## Coordination

- Chair: Carolin Schumacher, CEO Galvmed - Vice chair : Cheikh Ly, research associate initiative prospective Agricole et rurale
- **Mandate:** The first term would be for one year to develop the dynamic of the PFP and initiate its operational principles.
  - To map current available skills in the PFP and assess additional needs
  - To identify the best ways to coordinate with relevant regional and global activities
  - To define a worplan organised according to priorities

Further clarifications on the areas where resource mobilization have gone well and where there are challenges to tackle.

## Suggested PFP Work streams

- WS1. Ecosystem mapping & strategic partner engagement
- WS2. TADs communication & advocacy
- WS3. Funding system mapping and financing strategy development



**First assignment: Guidance to MC on costing, resource mobilization, partnering and engagement in support of PPR GEP II (delivery by end of October 2022, launch of GEP II)**



## Possible recommendations

- Countries to map current and missing partners to achieve control programmes against FMD and PPR
- Countries to cost the national programme against FMD and PPR for the next 5 years (or until eradication) and identify the available resources
- GF-TADs secretariat (regional and global) to liaise with the countries to provide information on situation and needs to the PFP
- PFP to provide recommendations for the region to relevant GF-TADs governing bodies (Management committee, regional steering committee,...) and participate as necessary to relevant activities in the region
