Gather data and insights regarding the implementation of WOAH standards

- **Purpose:** Assess the level of implementation of WOAH standards
- **Methods:** Data gathering (existing datasets) and collection of specific information via surveys, interviews, etc. Data analysis.

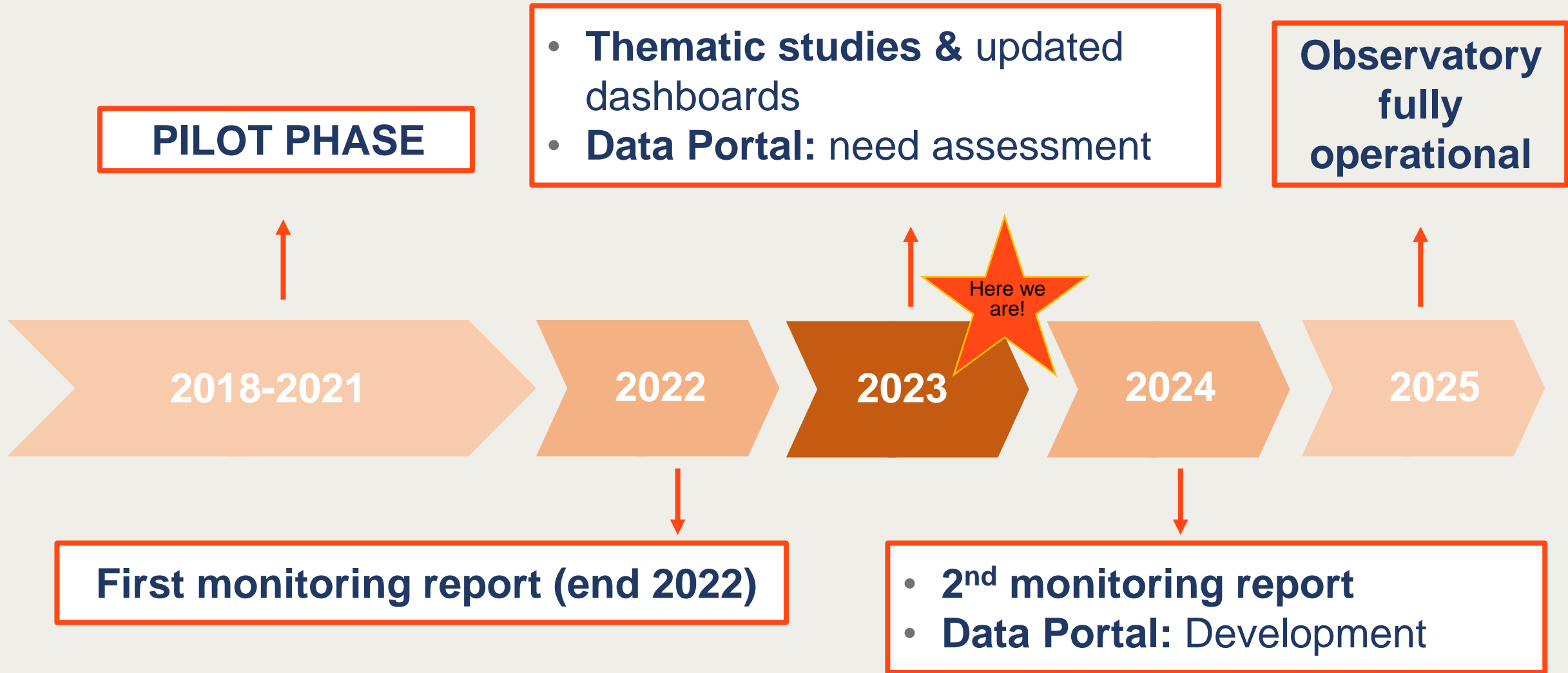
Identify areas where the implementation of WOAH standards falls short

- **Challenges:** Investigate obstacles to the implementation of standards
- **Recommendations & call for actions:**
 - Enhance implementation strategies and capacity building
 - Feedback to the standards setting process if necessary

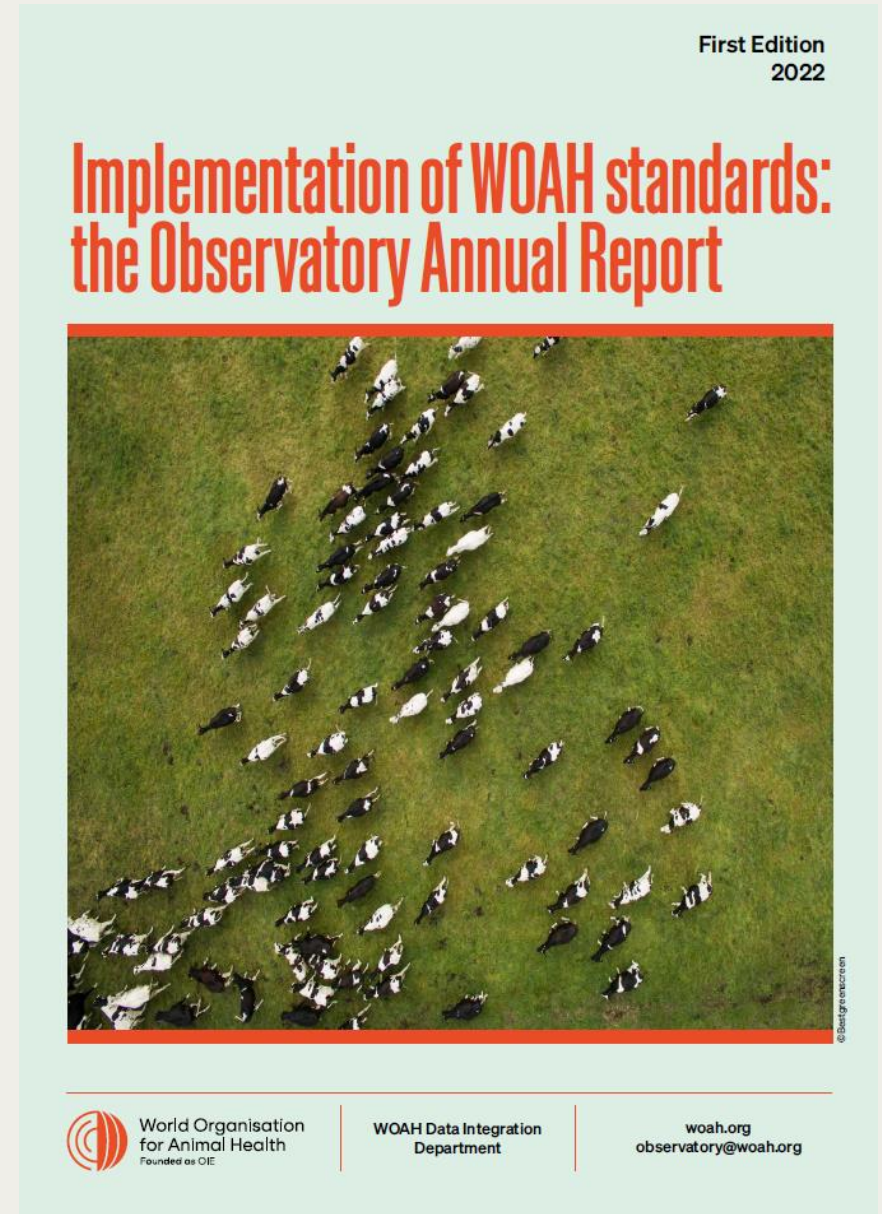
Dissemination of information, preserving confidentiality

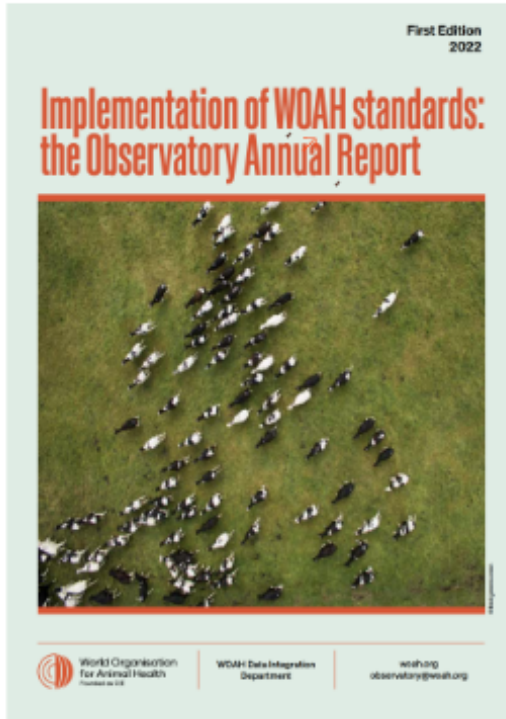
- **Target audience:** Stakeholders who need to be informed
- **Communication channels:** Effective methods for sharing information
- **Confidentiality measures:** Safeguard sensitive data and maintain privacy

Overarching goal: Improve effectiveness and use of WOAH standards

WOAH begins annual benchmarking report

THE World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH, formerly OIE) has for the first time published a report attempting to analyse the extent to which its members comply with its standards.

Although the exercise is fraught with complexity (not least because much data on countries' performance come from their own self-declarations in response to survey questions), the report is noteworthy as it marks

an 'important' for human health to promote growth in livestock. The report reveals that 10 countries engaged in this are in the Americas, with five in the Asia Pacific region and four in Africa.

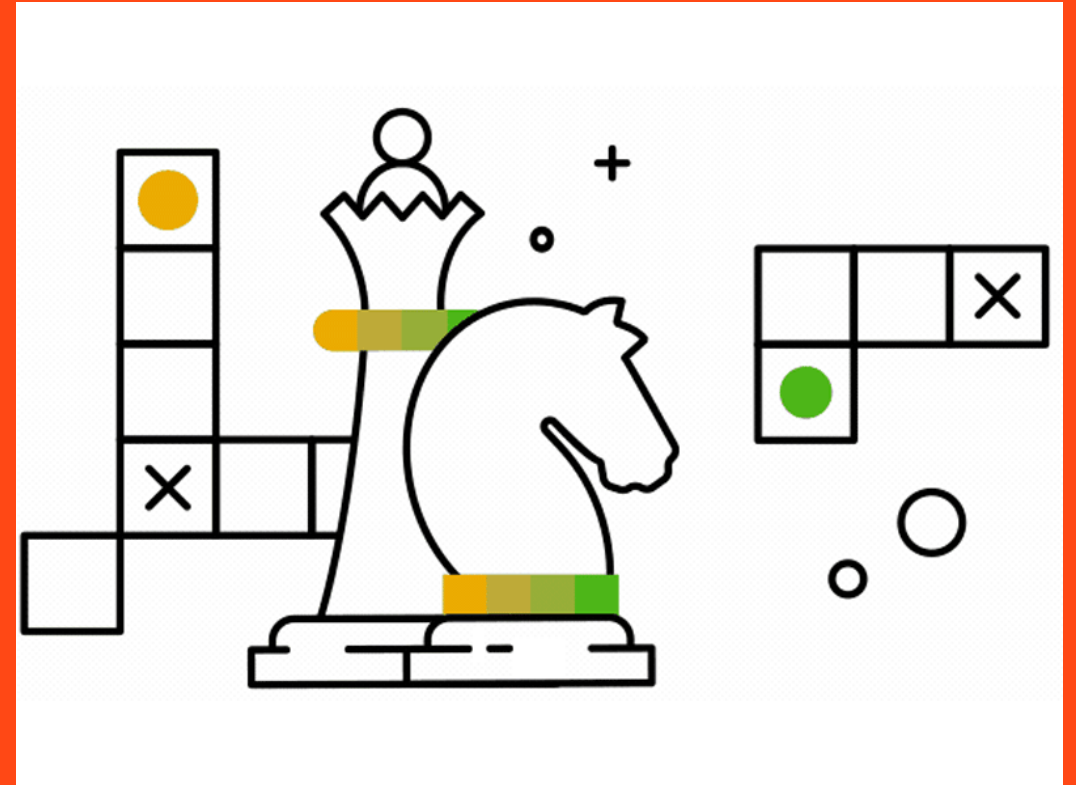
The WOAH has called on its members to urgently cease the use of antimicrobials in this way. Funding from the UK's Fleming Fund is helping the organisation direct targeted support towards countries where particular problems are identified.



Observatory work presented and acknowledged in several events organised by other international organisations.



2. Strategic adjustments of the Observatory programme



Purpose of this report: Analyse data and trends and provide elements and recommendations for decision-making

Context

- Most key findings and long-term data trends will not change year to year
- Many recommendations will take years to implement
- Data gaps for existing key data sources including SMR and WAHIS annual reports, unlikely to be filled soon

Much of the content of the “Annual” report is unlikely to change year to year

- Developing the monitoring report is resource intensive

Resources could be better used in developing thematic studies



Indicators

Annually

- **Annually monitored** and displayed in updated dashboards

Comprehensive report

5 years

- **Synchronised with** the preparation of the WOA Strategic Plans → **next report to be published at the end for 2024 (and none in 2023)**

Concise report

3 years

- Support the newly elected Specialist Commissions in formulating their work plan

Thematic studies

Several per year

- **More time could be dedicated to Thematic Studies (the year during which the report is not published)**

No additional thematic study will be started in 2024, which will be dedicated to the next full report, expected in Jan 2025.

Survey open from 30 May to 4 September 2023

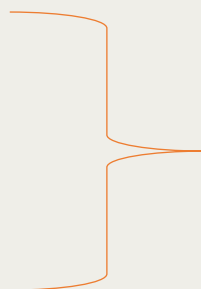
Response rates: 119 Members (65%) completed at least one of the three questionnaires and 86 Members (47%) completed all three questionnaires.

In Middle East, **8** Members (67%) completed the questionnaire on AI;

7 Members (58%) on FMD.

- **Target respondents:**

- **For (2), collaboration with the International Egg Commission (IEC) and International Poultry Council (IPC)**
- **Data collection via online questionnaires and focus group discussions**
- **Private sector questionnaires to be launched late 2023**

Animal welfare during transport by land and sea: level of implementation of WOAHA standards and challenges faced

Objectives & methods

- Assess to what extent the standards related to transport of live animals are implemented in WOAHA Members → **Survey**
 - Seek for feedback on Members' overall experience with these standards (what factors facilitate their implementation versus what barriers prevent their implementation) → **Focus group discussions**
- **Inform standard revision process of the Code commission.**



Background:

- Concept of a data portal identified and validated in the early design phase of the Observatory
- In line with the objectives of the 7th Strategic Plan and WOA's digital transformation and key element of data integration

Initial objective: design a Two-way web Portal to allow Members to access and submit data to the Observatory



Re-focused objective: design a data Portal to share Observatory data and meet Members' needs for efficient and user-friendly data access



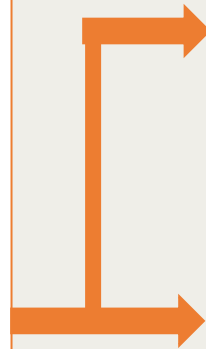

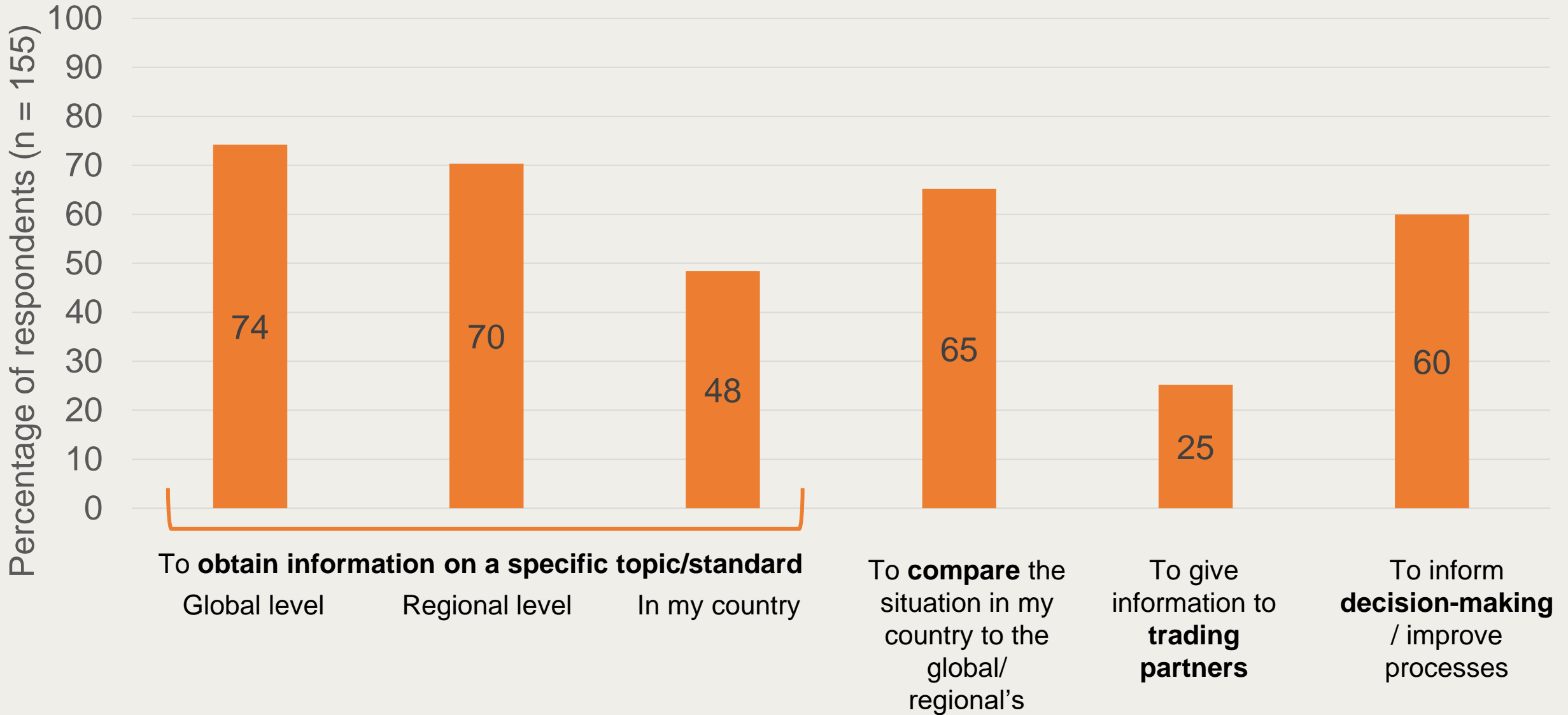

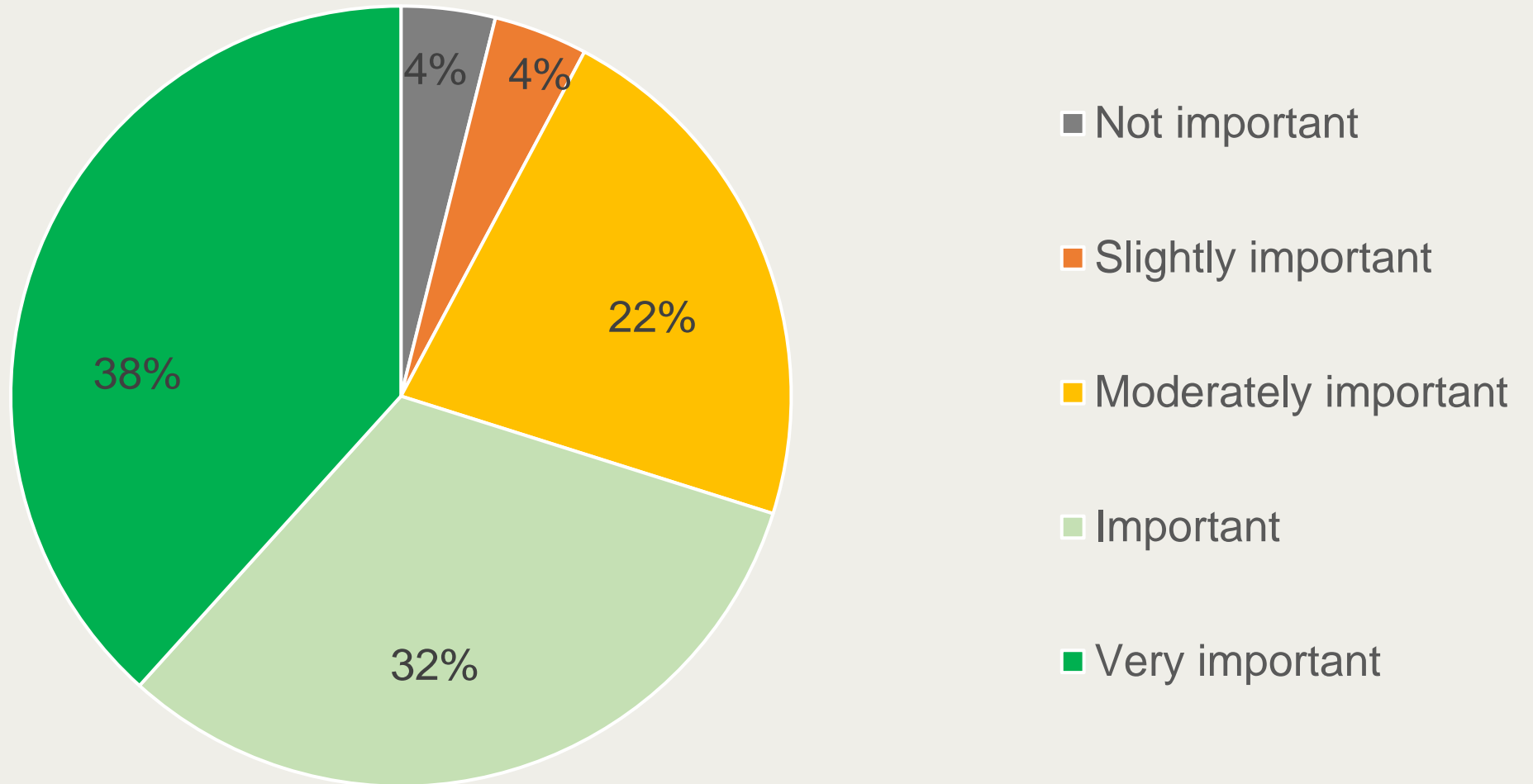
Interested users

For what purpose(s) would you use our data platform?

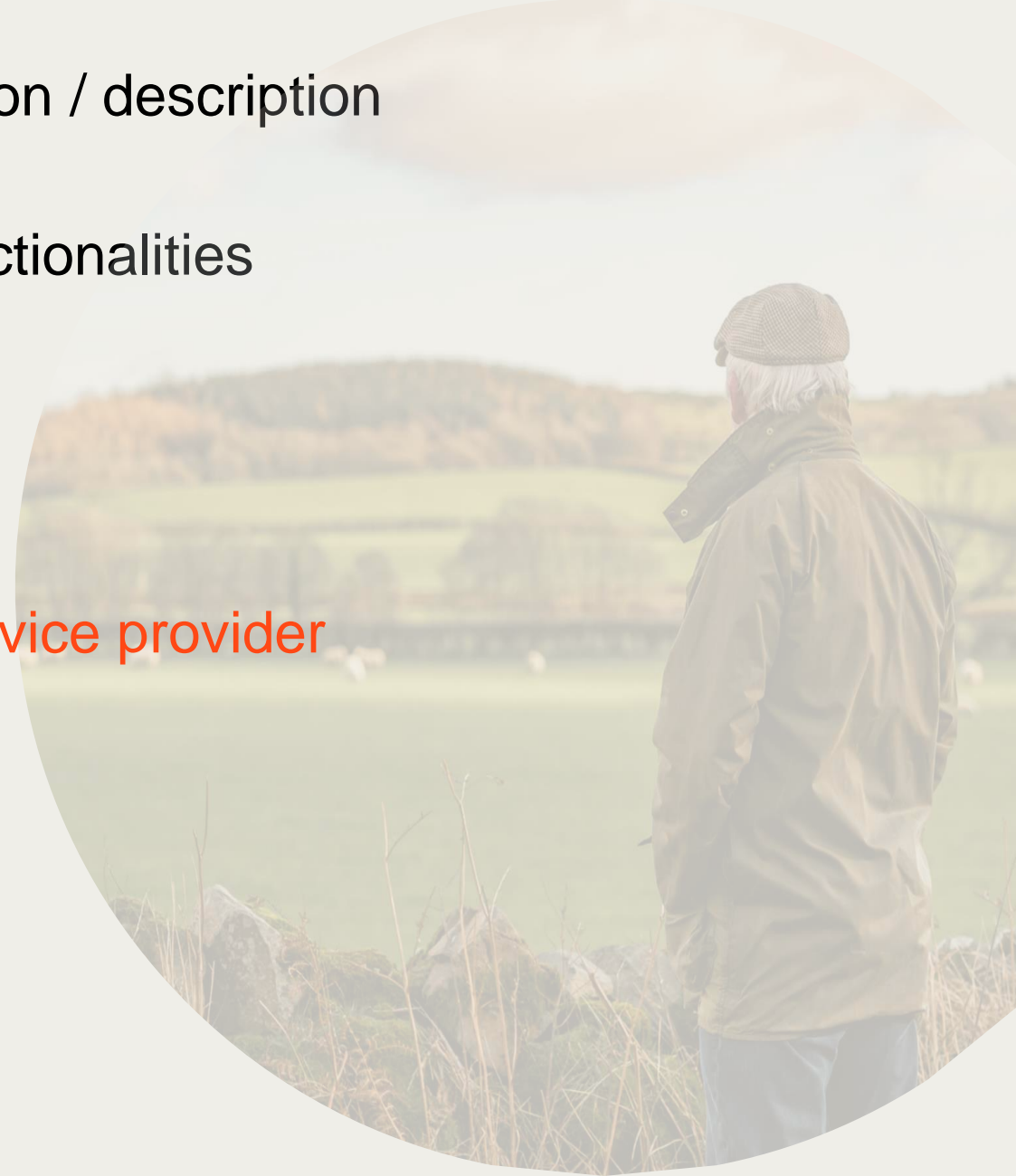


How important would it be for you to be able to access a private section of the platform where you could find data specifically related to your country?
