Regional Coordination meeting on HPAI situation in the Middle East and action plans guided by Global HPAI Strategy

17 to 19, December 2024 in Amman, Jordan

"Recommendations and follow-up"

The participants collectively agreed on the following results, which should be a prerequisite for a relevant regional action plan:

1. Assessment of the Current Situation and Benchmarking

• Strengthen surveillance and reporting programs to have up-to-date knowledge of the situation, covering not only poultry, but also wild birds and mammals, which is essential for an overall view of the spread and control of avian influenza.

 \cdot Conduct a detailed evaluation of the status of avian influenza across regional countries to identify challenges and strengths.

 \cdot Compare regional practices and outcomes with those of other regions, such as the EU and the Americas, to identify gaps and adopt best practices.

2. Selection and Customization of Effective Models

 \cdot Review and analyze various operational and organizational models for addressing avian influenza.

 \cdot Choose the model most suitable for regional needs, with the flexibility to adapt and upgrade it based on evolving requirements.

3. Establishment of a Regional Network

· Secure consensus among decision-makers to create a structured regional network.

 \cdot Design the network to address specific subject areas and define its governance under relevant bodies.

4. Collaborative Problem-Solving and Recommendations

· Allocate representatives from each member country to different sections of the network.

 \cdot Engage experts within these sections to identify challenges, propose solutions, and draft actionable recommendations.

5. Implementation, Capacity Building and Emergency Preparedness

 \cdot Develop and refine national emergency preparedness plans to address HPAI outbreaks, ensuring alignment with regional and global strategies.

 \cdot Conduct simulation exercises at both national and regional levels to test these plans, identify gaps, and refine response mechanisms.

· Secure government endorsement and funding to implement agreed-upon strategies.

• Provide training programs, technical support, and resources to enhance diagnostic, surveillance, and response capacities.

 \cdot Use the outcomes of simulation exercises and continuous improvement processes to strengthen preparedness and response efforts.

6. WOAH HPAI Reference Laboratory

Serves as a regional center of excellence for avian influenza by:

• Providing advanced diagnostic services, technical expertise, and training to support national and regional laboratories.

 \cdot Harmonizing diagnostic standards and fostering collaboration to strengthen surveillance and control efforts across the region.

This framework integrates the **WOAH Reference Laboratory** as a key technical pillar, ensuring robust diagnostics, quality standards, and technical guidance in combating avian influenza.

The establishment of a **Standing Group of Experts** on HPAI as a governance and coordination body will ensure a unified approach to formalising the regional work plan and ensuring its follow-up.
