




• Free countries and zones: maintain and improve their status

GF-TADs FMD Working Group

Established in 2011, initially FAO & WOAH; EuFMD joined in 2018;



- Guided by its Terms of Reference and the GF-TADs Management Committee;
- Promote the implementation of the strategy
- Activities at Global, Regional and National level;
- Meeting every 2 weeks.




- 7 GFTADs FMD Roadmaps established

Regional Advisory Groups (RAG)

- Elected in each Roadmap region
- Leadership in guiding FMD control in the region and accept countries in PCP stages



NB. Pools 1 (E. Asia) and 7 (S. America) do not have roadmaps but these countries collaborate in other regional initiatives, ie SEACFMD and COSALFA



Middle East Regional Roadmap

- 14 countries belong to the Middle East FMD Roadmap
 - Bahrain, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Oman, Palestine,
 Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, United Arab Emirates, and Yemen.
- 5 previous FMD roadmap meetings
 - 2012, 2013, 2015, 2017 and 2021) and
 - 2 Epidemiology and laboratory network (2019, 2021)
 - Regional Roadmap meetings are regularly organized as GF-TADs events by the FMD Working Group hand-in-hand with FAO and WOAH regional/(sub)regional offices



Middle East Regional Roadmap

2021 Meeting Recommendations highlighted (inter alia):

- improve regional coordination and knowledge about the epidemiology of FMD and circulating FMDV strains
- conducting PVM studies regularly, to continue assessing the quality of the vaccine and vaccination programme and to determine the cost benefits:
- strengthen capacities and ensure best use of the limited resources available
- consider engaging in the WOAH PVS to update understanding of their VS capacity, and guidance on investments on veterinary systems.
- initiate dialogue with countries in the region and exporting countries, to develop a framework to address the challenge of informal cross-border movement animal
- seek to combine the prevention and control activities for FMD with those of other livestock diseases such as PPR and **CBPP**



Meeting recommendations

MENET NETWORKS MEETING /irtual meeting, 6-9 December 2021

- combined control of FMD with other animal diseases




Key principles of the PCP-FMD









