Public-private partnerships are a joint approach in which the public and private sectors agree responsibilities and share resources and risks to achieve common objectives that deliver benefits in a sustainable manner.




























# **Context - Global FMD Control Strategy**

... other elements to support TAD control will become increasingly important when progressing through the FMD-PCP Stages, including ... development of public-private partnerships ....

#### Examples:

- boost worldwide vaccine production
- strong links between the public sector and the private sectors have been shown invaluable for countries facing emergency disease situations
- Developing PPP that ensure that livestock owners are involved in surveillance and control initiatives.
- → the private sector is one of the pillars of the WOAH standard on good governance
- Strengthening & training needed













# Context - EuFMD workplan (phase V)

#### Pillar II

Improved national FAST control plans, networks and regular co-ordination with Gf-TADs partners and international agencies

Promotion of public-private partnerships (PPP) for FAST monitoring and control and development of new partnerships

→ Improved engagement with private sector (including private veterinarians, training providers and vaccine producers) in line with PCP and PPP principles





















#### **Context - WOAH**

➤ WOAH key strategic priority: ensuring the capacity and sustainability of Veterinary Services (ref. WOAH 6th Strategic Plan – 2016-2020)

➤ **WOAH objective:** to support its members to develop sustainable PPPs to strengthen Veterinary Services
























### **WOAH PPP initiatives**

- 2016: WOAH began a 3-year initiative on PPPs, in collaboration with the French Research Institute for Agricultural Development (CIRAD); funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.
- 2017: Resolution #39 at WOAH 85thGS; and an online survey of public and private partners: 97
   PPP success stories from 76 countries.
- **2018:** Brochure and typology released at 86thGS; Expert consultation, with 42 international public and private experts PPP impact assessment on case examples.
- 2019: The «WOAH PPP Handbook» of guidelines released at the 87thGS; E-learning modules; 4 joint regional workshops in Africa and Asia to disseminate guidelines; PPP is integrated into PVS Pathway as targeted support activities.
- 2020: APPP-FAST virtual course. (jointly with EuFMD)
- 2021: training WSs and supporting PPPs in a number of selected countries (Jointly with EuFMD).

## **EuFMD's ongoing PPP activities**

- Fostering and coordinating PPP initiatives in the EuFMD's countries of focus has been embedded in the EuFMD workplan. As such, three main PPP projects are facilitated and technically supported by the EuFMD:
  - **South-East Europe (Iran):** this PPP initiative is focused on implementing Foot-and-Mouth Disease post-vaccination monitoring (PVM)
  - North Africa (Algeria): focused on PPPs supporting sero-surveillance activities of FAST disease control.
  - **Middle East (Sudan):** focused on possible PPPs for reducing FAST disease transmission risk during exporting live animals from Sudan to the Gulf region.
- Training for Veterinary Paraprofessionals (VPP) supporting them in delivering essential animal health services for smallholder farmers (SHFS); in partnership with Health for animals and World Veterinary Association.










#### EuFMD model for APPP to FAST diseases control in Sudan

Existing areas of collaboration:

- Importation of vaccines;
- Immunogenicity studies;
- Ongoing initiative of producing FMD vaccine in Sudan;
- Infrastructure for export (establishing quarantine stations and Slaughterhouses)

#### Main areas for potential PPPs in Sudan

- PPPs applied to pastoralist systems: e.g.
  training & empowering community animal
  health workers & veterinary paraprofessionals,
  grazing density and feeding issues, etc.
- Vaccine security
- Export of live animals and animal products
   (red meat) from Sudan to the countries in the
   region: Improving surveillance, diagnostics,
   quarantine and other services
- Camel and horse health and export issues.
- Risk analysis and surveillance for HPAI in poultry sector


