Commenting on TAHSC work

- On the draft texts 1. To propose additional or alternative science-based provisions to enrich or complement the proposed texts;
 - 2. To express evidence-based concerns on potential challenges for the <u>implementation of the proposed texts</u> under specific conditions or contexts (e.g., Members, regions, species), if possible, providing a proposal for improvement of the text;
 - 3. To provide <u>new or different evidence that contradicts the proposed texts</u> (which has not been previously addressed by Commissions or experts);
 - Wording issues which could compromise the understanding or the meaning of the texts (in any of the three languages);

On the work programme

- To express <u>needs for new work</u> to be undertaken.
- To express needs to prioritise existing work items.
- To express points of interests for a specific work of priority order 3 and 4, as well as available information, evidence or expertise that could be taken into consideration for the development of the work.

- Delegates may propose experts for planned ad hoc Groups.

- Consult Commissions work programmes to identify potential future work

Ad hoc Groups

An ad hoc Group is convened at the initiative of the Director General to provide expert advice on a topic as defined by the Terms of Reference. The ad hoc Group reports are considered by the relevant Specialist Commission or Director General. An ad hoc Group usually comprises six internationally recognised experts and take into consideration geographical representation and gender balance.

Nomination of experts

Delegates may nominate experts for specific ad hoc Groups, in particular for those that are in the planning phase not yet formally established. Delegates are also invited to consult the Commission's work plan to identify potential upcoming area of work. Delegates may send the name(s) of the expert(s) via email to expert-applications@woah.org. However, experts must submit their relevant information by filling out this form. This information will be considered but does not guarantee that the expert will be selected. It will assist the WOAH in establishing a database of internationally recognised experts.



Adoption

- 1. In its February meeting the AAHSC, the BSC or the TAHSC proposes a set of new or revised standards that will be proposed for adoption at the upcoming General Session.
- 2. At the <u>General Session</u>, the relevant <u>Commission President</u> of the AAHSC, the BSC or the TAHSC presents the "new or revised standard" to the Assembly, for adoption.
- 3. The President responds to comments from the Members.
- 4. In response to comments, the Commission President may propose amendments with the primary aim of reaching a consensus, may propose to adopt the "new or revised standard" unchanged if consensus is clear, or may withdraw the proposal if consensus is not reached.
- 5. In rare cases, the Assembly can decide by a formal vote (2/3 majority).
- 6. If a text is not adopted the Commission reconsiders the work in the context of their work programmes.



Participation of Middle East Region

- Comments from Middle East region are less than other regions. There were no comments received for the last three Code Commission meetings (Sep22, Feb23, Sep23)
- Your comments are essential to ensure that the *Terrestrial Code* better reflects your region's contexts.
- When well justified, the comments are taken on board, as demonstrated by:
 - Modification of the work programme to include Crimea-Congo Haemorragic Fever (CCHF) – ongoing work on case definition – Manual chapter to be updated this year (23-24) – new Code chapter to be adopted in 2025 or 2026
 - Modification of the work programme to review chapters on bird diseases global review to amend surveillance, trade and status requirements – work expected to begin 2024
 - Veterinary legislation related to antimicrobial resistance revised chapter 6.10. for comments and adoption expected 2024



3. Introduction to the Code Commission

The Terrestrial Animal Health Standards Commission (the Code Commission), created in 1960, is responsible for overseeing developments of the Terrestrial Animal Health Code (the Terrestrial Code) and ensuring it reflects the latest current scientific development.



Ad hoc Groups and Working Groups

The ad hoc Groups and Working Groups may be requested to address specific topics to ensure that new or revised standards are based on the latest scientific evidence and knowledge. The views of the Members and partner international organisations are routinely sought through the circulation of draft and revised texts in the relevant Specialist Commission report.





4. Code Commission's work programme - State of play (September 2023)

The Code Commission's work programme outlines the current and planned work to be undertaken to develop and review *Terrestrial Code* standards.

State of play

- Work programme currently includes 74 work items
 - 48 items are active (i.e. priority 1 or 2)
 - Many items are in coordination with other Specialist Commissions, mainly SCAD and BSC

At September 2023 meeting

- 20 texts circulated for comments and adoption in 2024
- 9 texts circulated for comments
- 4 new proposals/requests considered
- 14 new work items added
- 21 work items closed (most of which are items on texts adopted at the 90th GS)

- 5. Proposed deletions should be shown using 'strikethrough' and additions using 'double underline' (please <u>do not use the automatic 'track-changes'</u> function provided by Word processing software);
- 6. The TAHSC strongly encourages Members to provide feedback on its work programme, including submitting <u>justified</u> proposals!
